Day 1 :: Arrival Delhi

Upon your arrival at Delhi International Airport, our team will be holding your name signage in the arrivals hall.

You will be met and transferred to your Hotel for Check-in with welcome briefing.

Our travel manager will then outline your wonderful itinerary ahead.

Enjoy rest day at leisure.

In 1911 the British Imperial Government moved capital of British India from Calcutta to Delhi. And accordingly construction in that year began. There are at least eight historical Delhi's, each constructed on, or near, the ruins of its predecessor, leaving a modern-day citadel that's dotted with ancient monuments. It offers a glimpse of both ancient and modern day India. The city of Delhi is a blend of two different yet perfectly balanced parts, the Old and the New Delhi. Old Delhi, founded as Shahjahanabad in 1639 as the capital of the great Mughal Empire, and New Delhi, designed by british architect Sir Edwin Lutyens and set-up in 1931 by viceroy of india Lord Irwin.

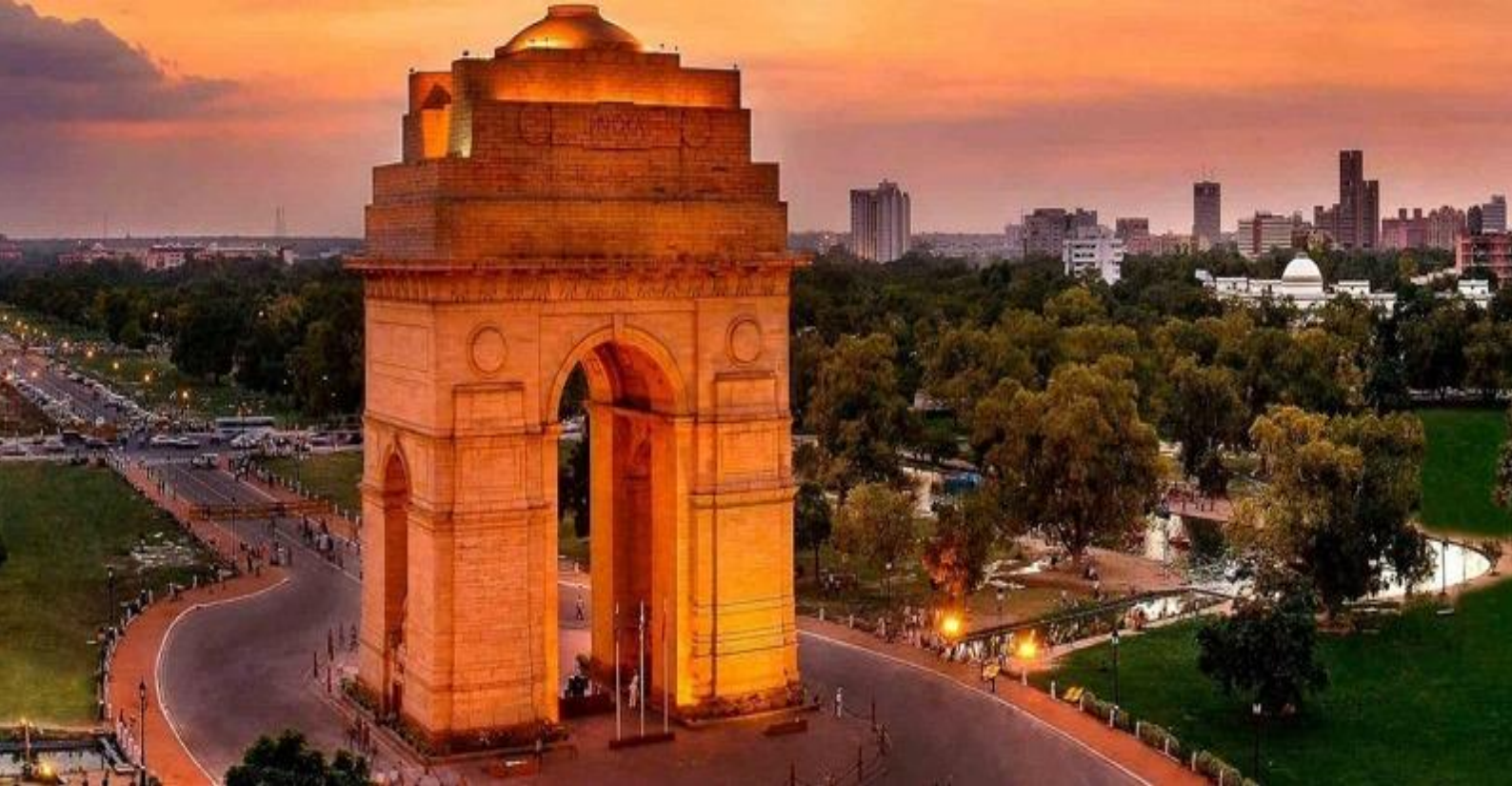


Day 2 :: Delhi old & new delhi tour / *Breakfast*

Step-back in time and discover the glory of the great Mughal empire and British raj of India. Your own private guide will ensure you get an in-depth experience of these emblematic structures & traditions of the local culture. After Breakfast you will be met by our expert Delhi Guide and our company Chauffeur, who will take you on a journey thru **Old Delhi**, founded as Shahjahanabad in 1639 as the capital of the great Mughal Empire.

Our first stop will be old walled-city of Delhi. We will visit the marvellous red-sandstoned **Jama Masjid Mosque** built by Mughal emperor and maker of taj mahal – Shah Jahan in 1644 AD showcasing finest indo-islamic architectures. Afterwards, we hop-on a traditional **Rickshaw Ride** tour exploring real life, tangy flavours and buzz of old city thru maze-like streets of the iconic wholesale bazaar **Chandni Chowk** and asia's largest spice trading markets **Khari Baoli**. Our ride ends with a photo-stop outside the imperial residence of Mughal empire and unesco heritage site **The Red Fort**, built in 1638 and rumoured to have the decapitated bodies of prisoners built into its foundations for luck. Next stop is at **Raj Ghat**, the memorial dedicated to father of India - Mahatma Gandhi. Later we visit **Gurudwara Sis Ganj** - The icing-sugar-white 18th-century Sisganj Gurdwara marks the martyrdom site of the ninth Sikh guru, Tegh Bahadur, executed by Aurangzeb in 1675 for resisting conversion to Islam. A banyan tree marks the spot where he was killed.





Afternoon we will arrive at the Lutyens city called **New Delhi**, designed by British architect Sir Edwin Lutyens and set-up in 1931 by viceroy of India Lord Irwin as a political hub. This colonial city with its European influences was a power symbol of the British Empire. We will explore fine works of Sir Edwin Lutyens, that later became the fabric and features of modern India. We cover New Delhi's most imposing sites such as **Gandhi Smriti**, the remembrance home - museum of Mahatma Gandhi; here on 30th Jan 1948 the father of India was assassinated. Ceremonial boulevard **Raj Path** designed by Lutyens in 1921 taking similarities from the *Champs Elysee of France*. Here we explore princely **State Houses** and architectures of **North - South Block** incl **India Gate**, a 42m-high stone memorial arch pays tribute to 70,000 soldiers of British Indian Army who died in the first world war. Presidents estate **Rashtrapati Bhawan**, former home to the British viceroy and today the largest residence of any head of state in the world. **The House of Parliament**, designed by Sir Herbert Baker in 1912 to construct a new administrative capital of British India. Afterwards, we journey to central parks of Delhi surrounded with downtown markets **Connaught Place** named after the duke of Connaught. This horse-shoe shaped market was built in the spirit of British colonial rule, as a grand shopping place where the new imperial city and the older native settlement would participate in trading. We will also cover the sacred **Gurudwara Bangla Sahib** that is one of the most prominent Sikh houses of worship in Delhi. Here we will experience a traditional **Sikh Kitchen** and its **Langar Ceremony**, where sacred meals are served regardless of caste, creed or religion. We will witness or if preferred we participate in the cooking ceremony to feed over 10,000 people a day. Imagine massive cooking pots stirred by strong-armed men with spoons the length of oars.





Day 3 :: Delhi Gurudawars's tour / *Breakfast*

Today morning after breakfast we will start the Gurudwara tour of Delhi by visiting:-

- **Gurudwara Nanak Piao** - This Gurudwara sahib is dedicated to the first Sikh Guru, Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji. Gurdwara Nanak Piao was built at the site, in the garden where Guru Nanak Dev camped when he visited Delhi in 1505 during the reign of Sultan Sikandar Lodi.
 - **Gurudwara Rakab Ganj** - One of the most historical Gurdwaras in Delhi, the magnificent Rakab Ganj Gurdwara is a sight to behold near Parliament House in New Delhi. Historical records name Baghel Sikh, the Sikh Military General, to be the one who constructed this Gurdwara in 1783. Gurdwara Rakab Ganj is known for being the cremation site of the headless body of the ninth Guru of Sikhs, the martyr Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, who gave his life, saving Hindu Kashmiri Pandits from Aurangzeb's cruelties in 1675.
 - **Gurudwara Shahidi Asthaan Baba Banda Singh Bahadur** - Situated in Mehrauli, near the Qutub Minar, this gurudwara marks the site of the Sikh martyr Baba Banda Singh Bahadur Ji. He was tortured to death by the Mughals in an ugly, vile and intolerable manner, along with his son and 40 other Sikhs on 28th April 1719. His name has mentioned with great pride in Sikh history for his fearless gallantry. This is one of the Iconic gurudwaras in Delhi,
 - **Gurudwara Bala Sahib** - Located at the crematory grounds of Guru Harkrishan Singh Ji, the 8th Guru of Sikhs as well as Mata Sundri, stands Gurudwara Bala Sahib. Bala Sahib was conferred with becoming a Guru at the age of 5 by succeeding his father, Guru **Har Rai Ji**. He is known for his healing touch which aided a lot of sufferers of cholera and smallpox in Delhi. Gurudwara Bala Sahib is located on the banks of River Yamuna in Delhi.
After visit return back to your hotel.
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Day 4 :: Delhi - Patna / *Breakfast*

Today morning after Breakfast/Checkout you will be transferred to Delhi airport to catch flight to **Patna**, capital city of Bihar.

*Depart **Delhi** (ETD: 1015 hrs by Indigo Airlines Flight 6E 5128) / Arrive **Patna** (ETA: 1140 hrs)
(Economy Class, 15kg check-in baggage and 7kg hand baggage) or similar*

Upon arrival at Patna Airport you will be met by our representative and transferred to your Hotel.

Patna, the capital city of Bihar, holds a unique place in the history of Sikhism as the 10th Guru, Guru Gobind Singh was born here. And to commemorate this grand event, Patna Sahib was formed. Gurdwara Patna Sahib is also considered amongst the holiest of the five "Takhts" or seat of authority of the Sikhs.

Overnight : Accommodation in PATNA

Accommodation for 2 nights including Breakfast

Day 5 Patna - Patna Sahib / *Breakfast*

After breakfast, visit **Takht Sri Patna Sahib**, which is one of the five takhts (PanjTakht) of Sikhism. Also, it is the birthplace of the tenth Guru Sri Guru Gobind Singh. After holy darshan return back to your hotel.





Day 6 :: Patna – Delhi - Chandigarh / Breakfast

Today morning after Breakfast/Checkout you will be transferred to Patna airport to catch flight to **Delhi**.

*Depart **Patna** (ETD: 0840 hrs by Indigo Airlines Flight 6E 2433) / Arrive **Delhi** (ETA: 1015 hrs)
(Economy Class, 15kg check-in baggage and 7kg hand baggage) or similar*

Upon arrival you will be met by our expert company chauffeur who will drive you to **Chandigarh** (300 Kms, approx.. 5-6 hrs drive) (drive includes enroute stop for clean restrooms).

Overnight : Accommodation in CHANDIGARH

Accommodation for 1 night including Breakfast

Day 7 :: Chandigarh – Bathinda / Breakfast

Today morning after Breakfast/Checkout we take you to the tour of Chandigarh visiting **Rock Garden - a remarkable showcase of individual creativity and resourcefulness** next we take you to **Zakir Hussain Rose Garden- which is spread over 30 acres of land, with 50,000 rose-bushes of 1600 different species**. After the tour continue your drive you to **Bhatinda** (120 Kms, approx.. 2-3 hrs drive).

Here you will visit **The Takht Sri Damdama Sahib**, one of the five takhts or Seat of Sikhism, located in Talwandi Sabo in Punjab. Upon arrival in Bathinda, you will Check-in at your hotel.

One of the Five Takhts or Seat of Authority of the Sikhs. This takhat is situated at Bathinda in Punjab, India and is the place where Guru Gobind Singh, the tenth Guru of the Sikhs prepared the full version of the Sikh Scriptures called Sri Guru Granth Sahib in 1705. The Damdame Wali Bir or Damdami Bir as it is sometimes called was completed here by Guru Gobind Singh. It was transcribed by Bhai Mani Singh. The hymns of Guru Tegh Bahadur Sahib, the ninth Guru and father of Guru Gobind Singh were added into the Bir.

Overnight : Accommodation in BATHINDA

Accommodation for 2 nights including Breakfast



Day 8 :: Bathinda Takht Sri Damdama Sahib / Breakfast

Today morning after breakfast, proceed for Morning Tour of **Gurudwara Damdama Sahib**. In the afternoon, tour of **Bathinda Fort, Gurudwara Haji Ratan** and **Gurudwara Quila Mubarak** Bathinda local market for shopping.

After tour return back to your hotel. Evening free to relax.

Day 9 :: Bathinda – Anandpur Sahib / Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Today morning after Breakfast/Checkout you will met by our expert company chauffeur who will drive you to **Anandpur Sahib** (260 Kms, approx.. 4-5 hrs drive) enroute visiting **Kiratpur Sahib famous Gurudwaras of Charan Kamal Sahib and Patal Puri Sahib** .

Upon arrival in Anandpur Sahib, you will Check-in at your hotel.

Anandpur Sahib, the Holy City of Bliss, is about 95 km north-west of Chandigarh, Punjab. The city is located in the Rupnagar district (Roper) in the state of Punjab, India. It is nestled between the Shivalik hills in the east and Sutlej River at far west. Furthermore, this place is surrounded with vast green stretch that delivers calmness and spiritualism in its aroma. It is considered as the holiest place of Sikh religion where Shiri Guru Gobind Singh Ji spent 25 years of his life teaching and guiding his disciplines.

Overnight : Accommodation in ANANDPUR SAHIB

Accommodation for 2 nights including Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner on American Plan



Day 10 :: Anandpur Sahib / *Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*

Today morning after breakfast we will start the Gurudwara tour by visiting :-

Gurudwara Takht Sri Kesgarh Sahib: This is the main hub at Anandpur Sahib. This place is the birthplace of the Khalsa. Among the Five Temporal Authorities (Five Takhts), this place holds an esteemed value in the religion of Sikhism. The Gurudwara is located on the hill where Shri Guru Gobind Singh Ji used to hold congregations.

Gurudwara Sis Ganj Sahib: November 11, 1675, Shri Guru Teg Bahadur Sahib Ji grasped martyrdom in Delhi. His behead was cremated at this place. People also believe that the oldest structure in the shrine is the central pedestal in the Gurudwara.

Gurudwara Guru Ka Mahal: In Anandpur Sahib, this is the first structure and building of Chak Nanaki. This place is worshiped as the 'Guru ka Mahal' complex. Along with Shri Guru Gobind Singh Ji, his disciples used to live here.

Gurudwara Bhora Sahib: It is the residence of Shri Guru Teg Bahadur Sahib Ji. This place has an underground room which was used for meditation and composing hymns.

Gurudwara Akal Bunga Sahib: This is situated opposite to the Gurudwara Sis Ganj Sahib. Shri Guru Gobind Singh Ji used to address the Sikhs to struggle for freedom and faith. He also asked people to stay prepared to fight tyranny and injustice.





Day 11 :: Anandpur Sahib - Amritsar / Breakfast

Today morning after Breakfast/Checkout & checkout you will be pickup from the hotel & driver to Amritsar, home to the spectacular Golden Temple (*a journey of approx. 3-4 hours, 190 Kms*) Upon arrival in Amritsar you will be met and assisted and transferred to your Hotel for check-in.

We travel to the holiest city of Sikhism Amritsar to evoke and explore its true spirits. Located in northwest Indian state of Punjab this is the home of world-famed change of guard ceremony border between India-Pakistan. And also a home of the Golden Temple famed as the holiest of the Sikh shrine, and attracts more visitors than even the Taj Mahal.

Overnight : Accommodation in AMRITSAR

Accommodation for 3 nights including Breakfast





Day 12 :: Amritsar / *Breakfast*

After breakfast you will be met by our expert City guide who will take you on a journey thru Amritsar We begin with a temple tour inside **Laxmi Narayan Temple** dedicated to worshipping hindu goddess 'Durga'-*the goddess of wealth*. Next we visit the memorial of **Jalianwala Bagh** where in 1919 hundreds of defenceless Indians were massacred by British troops on an auspicious day of Punjabi New Year on 13April. Next we visit inside the holiest of Sikh shrine **Golden Temple**. Here we also visit its Holy Kitchen **Langar** that believes in giving unlimited free food to the needy.

The legendary Golden Temple is actually just a small part of this huge gurdwara complex, known to Sikhs as Harmandir Sahib. Spiritually, the focus of attention is the tank that surrounds the gleaming central shrine – the Amritsar Sarovar, from which Amritsar takes its name, excavated by the fourth Sikh guru, Ram Das, in 1577. Ringed by a marble walkway, the tank is said to have healing powers, and pilgrims come from across the world to bathe in its sacred waters.

Early evening you will be picked up from your hotel and driven to **Attari Border / Wagah Border** to experience Sunset Ceremonial *Beating Retreat Ceremony* performed by the security forces of **India** (*Border Security Force, BSF*) and **Pakistan** (*Pakistan Rangers*). This drill is characterized by elaborate and rapid dancelike manoeuvres. Nationals of both nations shouting slogans in National spirit during Ceremony. After ceremony drive back to your hotel & relax.





Day 13 :: Amritsar / *Breakfast*

Today morning after Breakfast you will visit the nearby shrines of **Tarn Taran** and **Goindwal** to see many historical Gurudwaras. Goindwal was the first Sikh pilgrimage centre.

Gurudwara Tarn Taran Sahib: A well-known Sikh shrine, is located in the city's heart. It is the Gurudwara with the largest Sarovar (water pond) of all the Gurudwaras. It is the only Gurudwara in the world that is a copy of Amritsar's Shri Harminder Sahib. It is also known for the monthly pilgrimage on the day of amavasya (no moon light).

Gurudwara Shri Baoli Sahib and Shri Goindwal Sahib: is situated in the Goindwal Sahib in Tarn Taran Distt. This is the first sikh pilgrimage which was prepared under the supervision of Shri Guru Amar Das Ji in year 1616 AD. GURU SAHIB then blessed this holy place and decreed that whosoever does 84 paaths of JAPJI SAHIB with a pure heart and baths in the BAOLI SAHIB shall be freed from the cycle of birth and death. Shri Guru Amardas Ji himself performed Seva of Gurdwara Baoli Sahib. Guru Sahib also appointed 22 Manjis for spreading's messages of Sikhism in different parts of India





Day 14 :: Depart Amritsar – Arrive Delhi - onward Destination / *Breakfast*

Our tour ends after Breakfast/Checkout from your Hotel lobby you will be picked-up and transferred to Amritsar Airport to catch your onward flight to Delhi.

*Depart **Amritsar** (ETD: 1300 hrs by Air India Flight AI 492) / Arrive **Delhi** (ETA: 1420 hrs)
(Economy Class, 15kg check-in baggage and 7kg hand baggage) or similar*
