DAY 01: BIA – COLOMBO (50 Kms - 45 minutes approx.)

On arrival at the Bandaranaike International Airport, you will meet your representatives & transferred directly to Colombo. After checking into your hotel, you are free for the rest of the day on.

Colombo - Sri Lanka's largest seaport as well as the historic gateway to the Orient. Located on the west coast, combines all of the cultures, faiths, and influences of distant nations into a potpourri of noises, smells, and a kaleidoscope of color. The early traders and immigrants, the Arabs, Portuguese, Dutch, and British, left behind churches and monuments, names and religions, clothing and food, as well as smatterings of their languages that have become ingrained in Sri Lankan speech. Today, Colombo is a fascinating city - a harmonious blend of east and west, past and present, with its own distinct charm whose attractions include the majestic Buddhist temples, the Colombo Museum, the Bandaranaike Memorial International Conference Hall, the New Parliament in Sri Jayawardenepura, and Independence Square.

On completion, you will be comfortably transferred directly to Trinco. En-route you will visit The Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage.

Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage

DAY 03: Explore Trincomalee

Afternoon Experience Sri Lankan rural village experience with traditional cookery demo. Here's what you can expect from the Village Trek.

Scenic Nature Walk:

The trek typically begins with a walk through lush green forests and along the edges of a reservoir or lake. The path winds through the village, offering picturesque views of paddy fields, mountains, and waterways.

Bullock Cart Ride: (If interested only)

Participants often have the chance to ride in a traditional bullock cart, which is an ancient mode of transportation still used in rural areas. This ride provides a nostalgic experience and a glimpse into the traditional lifestyle of Sri Lankan villagers.

Village Experience:

DAY 05: Explore Pidurangala & Polonnaruwa. (125 Kms – 2-3 Hrs approx.)

In the early morning, visit the **Pidurangala Rock Fortress** to catch a breathtaking sunrise.

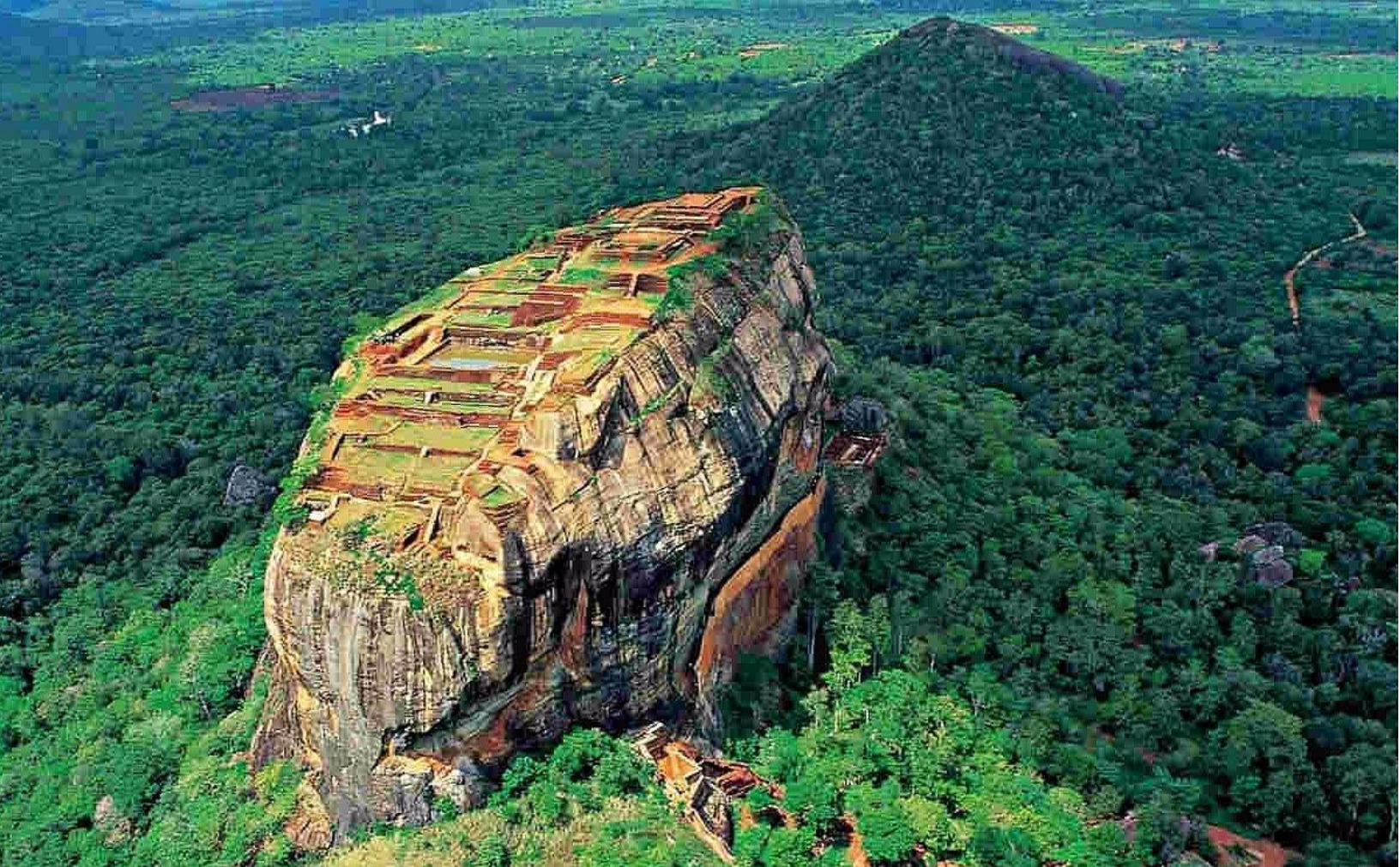

Spice Garden

En route from Kandy to Nuwara Eliya, we can arrange for a visit to a **tea factory**, providing you with a fascinating insight into the process of tea production in Sri Lanka.

Tea Factory Visit

Renowned for its rich biodiversity, montane grasslands, and cloud forests, the park is part of the UNESCO-listed Central Highlands. The trek provides breathtaking views, opportunities for wildlife encounters, and visits to several iconic landmarks.*

Key Highlights of the Trek

- **World's End:** This is one of the most famous viewpoints in Sri Lanka. The sheer drop of about 870 meters (2,854 feet) offers breathtaking panoramic views. On clear days, you can see as far as the southern coastline.
- **Baker's fall:** A beautiful waterfall located along the trek, named after the British explorer Sir Samuel Baker. It's surrounded by lush vegetation and is a great spot for photography.
- **Flora and Fauna:** Horton Plains is home to unique wildlife such as the sambar deer, purple-faced langur, and various bird species. You may also spot endemic plants and flowers in this unique ecosystem.
- **Misty Plains and Grasslands:** The hike passes through misty grasslands, making it a unique experience compared to other tropical hikes in Sri Lanka. The plains are usually enveloped in fog during the early morning.

Trek Details

- **Distance:** The loop trail is about 9 km (5.6 miles) and typically takes 3 to 4 hours to complete.
- **Difficulty:** It's considered a moderate trek, accessible to most fitness levels. The trail is well-marked and mostly flat, though there are some rocky and uneven sections.

On completion proceed back to Nuwara Eliya.

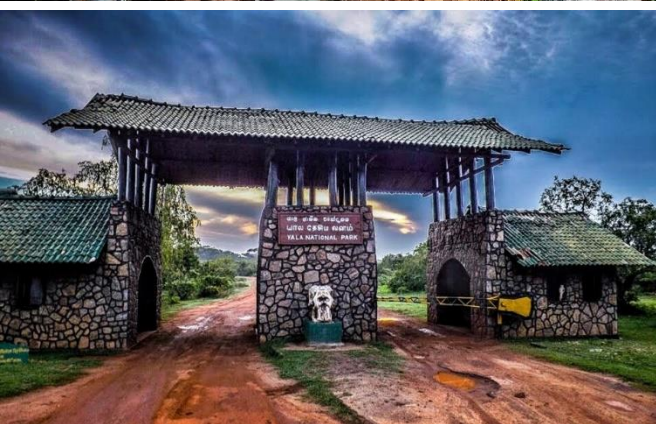
